1. What is artistic expression?

4. What role does art play in local and global societies? Please give an example.

6. What does art have to do with religion and politics? Please give examples.

The relationship between art, politics and religion has always been complex. Their links and relative autonomies have usually been analyzed in relation to the circles and institutions within society in certain historical periods and frames. Art, power and church are needed forever. Some of the greatest artistic works exist because of this close relationship between art, politics and religion. In relation between art and religion, in all cultures throughout history, religion has played a key role in their development, influencing the motives, concerns, form and function and often using it to express a culture's interests. Religious guardianship has left multitude of plastic representations of very different sensitivity according to its own conception of sensory and spiritual world.

7. Define and Explain Creativity

Creativity, also called original thinking, creative thinking, inventive, constructive imagination or divergent thinking is the ability to create, to innovate, to generate new ideas or approaches, or new combinations between known ideas and concepts, which normally lead to new conclusions, solve problems and produce original and valuable solutions. Creativity is the production of an idea or a concept, a creation or exploration that is new, original, useful and satisfying both the creator and some others from some period.

8. What should the rules of censorship be in the country where you live?

Censorship is the control of information by someone who has a monopoly of power. In democratic systems as the US, there is no censorship, because the law provides one of the fundamental freedoms: freedom of the press. It is a specific section of liberty and it is that citizens and the media can express freely their ideas, as long as it is done within the provisions of the law (for example, it is prohibited to advocate violence or terrorism). The absence of censorship in democracies does not prevent some individuals or entities try to limit the information and even subtly implement certain dose of censorship. Totalitarian regimes try to control all information in the media. This control is often inflexible, because the purpose of dictatorships is to stay in power and that people cannot have accurate information about reality. To impose this type of control, totalitarianism put in place a complex system. Certain topics and criticism of power is unacceptable and are prohibited. Some words and expressions are also prohibited. Journalists and reporters must show their work to the censors can determine whether or not permitted. Naturally, the literary and creative activity is also subject to the limitations of censorship. Writers, journalists and artists in general have to undergo what establishes the system of censorship and if they cannot pay with jail or some kind of penalty. For this reason, there are writers and creators who choose exile, preferring freedom instead not being subjected to a dictatorial regime.

In some cases, in dictatorships, ideas are expressed in an indirect way and veiled manner, avoiding censorship filters by indirect or concealed criticism. While freedom of expression is a social conquest of democracy, it must be exercised from personal responsibility. In fact, the law protects the free expression of ideas, but penalizes slander and calumny.

9. Should all poetry, music or art be beautiful? Explain.

Beauty is associated with good looks. It is a subjective appreciation: what is beautiful for one person, could not be for another. However, it is known as canon of beauty that there are certain characteristics that society in general considers as attractive, desirable and pretty. The conception of beauty varies across cultures and changes over the years. Beauty produces pleasure that comes from sensory manifestations and that can feel for the sight (for example, a person who is attractive viewed from the physical point of view) or sound (hearing a voice or a nice music). The smell, taste and touch, however, are not related to beauty. Beyond this sensory manifestation, there should be consideration that some abstract and conceptual things are beautiful. A moral reflection can be highlighted as a beautiful text for example.

One of the most widespread standards of beauty is harmony. Humans tend to think that harmony and the right proportions are desirable.

The opposite of beauty is ugliness with no pleasure but discontent and creates a negative perception of the object. Perhaps today we can conclude that the poetry, music and art can be beautiful or ugly depending on the purpose pursued.

10. What do you think this class will teach you that you do not already know?

I think this course could help me improve the utilization of different artistic languages as tools in the service of creation, expression, communication and understanding of reality, while helping me develop more skills and abilities that are necessary for the appreciation and creation of artistic productions.
